The study shows that Mizo has the same word order for all types of subordinating clauses, which precede the main clause. Even in cleft sentences too, it has the same order. Considering the syntactic nature and semantic interpretation of clefts and passives, analyses of these structures have been included. Shows

that Mizo clefts are biclausal in nature. Mizo passives have three different structures among which one is biclausal in nature and the other two are monoclausal.
