#### *Abstract*

The present study was carried out with the objective of assessing availability and use of e-resources in the libraries of management institutions located in National Capital Region. The research method applied to carry out the study is survey method. The questionnaire method is used for data collection that is followed by interview and observation method for data validation and cross-verification. The findings of the study revealed that majority of management libraries needs to upgrade their e-resource collection particularly with regard to various specialisation of the field. The libraries also need to add various types of e-resources such as e-books, e-dissertations, e-reports, e-newspapers, e-magazines etc. It was revealed that the users were aware about various types of e-resources available in their respective libraries but variation among various categories of users were found when it comes to usage. The students need to be encouraged about using e-resources subscribed by their institutional libraries. The research work also highlighted that informal methods of learning skills to use e-resources have received higher percentage scores compared to formal methods. Thus, the management institutes' libraries need to use more formal methods in order to make users aware about what is actually available in their libraries. With respect to use of searching techniques also it was found that users preferred to use information search through keywords instead of advance searching techniques. Again this fact indicated that users must be given proper training under Information literacy programme about using advance search strategies. Hence efforts must be made by the

libraries to enhance both their e-resource collection as well as ICT infrastructure to ensure optimum utilization of e-resources. The future of management libraries also greatly depend upon adopting more collaborative approaches via consortia and networks towards building and providing access to vast range of e-resources.
