### Abstract (Not Verified)

This dissertation is a study of the political mobilisation of the Indian community in China during the Second World War under the banner of the Indian National Army (INA) and itspolitical superstructure, the Indian Independence League (IIL). The INA has been largelystudied from the perspectives of Southeast Asia and Japan. However, there is very lessawareness that the INA had a considerable following among the Indians in China during the war period and was instrumental in the radicalisation of the immigrant Indianpopulation comprising mostly of soldiers, policemen, watchmen, moneylenders, traders, merchants, and political exiles. It was among these Indian émigrés that the INA found itsmembers and supporters in China. In China, branches of the INA were established in allthe places which had Indian population. The political mobilisation of Indians in China hasbeen one of the most understudied subjects of war period Sino-Indian interactions andhas received little scholarly attention. This dissertation seeks to investigate multiplefactors like the contemporary global geopolitics, the domestic political condition in India, the political situation in China among others to understand this mobilisationphenomenon. The support that the INA could garner in the Indian community wasunprecedented in the case of the Indians in China. How did the INA manage to achieve this political cohesion? What were the salient features of the INA's political mobilisationphenomenon in China? It will further probe the grim repercussions that the Indians inChina had to face at the end of the War as a result of their wartime political activities. This dissertation also seeks to answer the important question of what does the INAepisode tell us about the nature of Sino-Indian interactions at a crucial period just beforeIndia's independence in 1947 and the Chinese Revolution of 1949.
